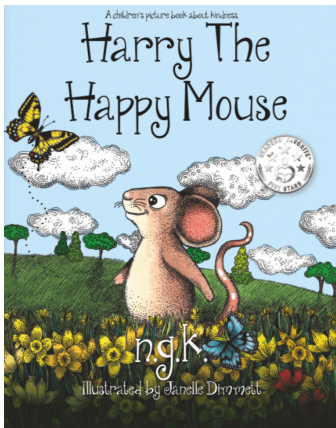


Year 1 English Knowledge Organiser

Narrative - story with a familiar setting

Harry The Happy Mouse

Harry The Happy Mouse is a traditional story about a mouse called Harry who lives under the bridge in the colourful English countryside. Harry goes for a walk every evening and enjoys meeting his animal friends. One sunny evening Harry finds a frog stuck on a log. Harry helps a frog, but asks the frog to repay the kindness to someone else. The kindness is spread through the story where the characters help each other and spread happiness and joy through the countryside.



Poetry, songs and rhyme

A poem is made up of words and some of the words rhyme. Rhyming words have the same sound for example pat, sat, mat.

Hickory Dickory Dock

Hickory dickory **dock**.
The mouse went up the **clock**
The clock struck one.
The mouse went down
Hickory dickory **dock**
Tick tock, tick tock, tick tock, tick **tock**.

setting - where a story takes place

plot - what happens in a story

characters - who is in the story

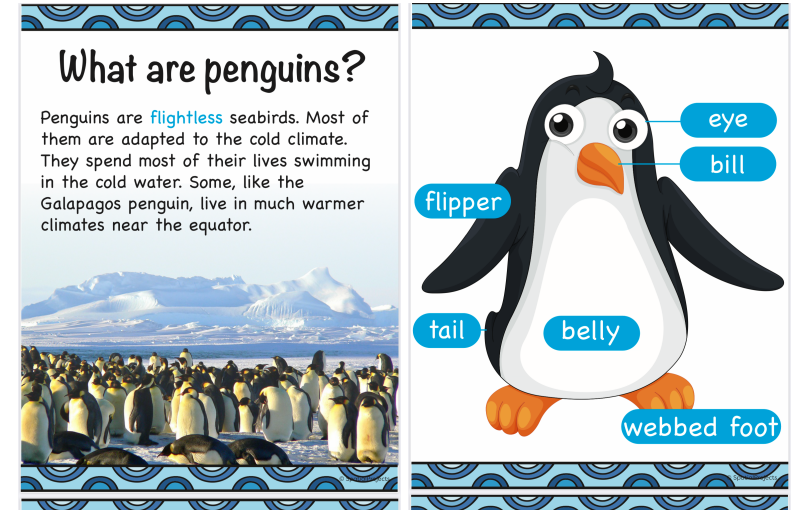
prediction - making a guess

A non - fiction text has a title which tells you what you will be reading about. Some non- fiction texts include pictures with captions. A caption labels parts of a picture to tell you the name or give you details about the picture.
