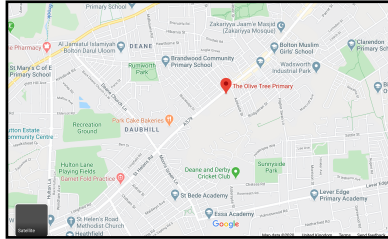


The Great Outdoors - Summer 1
