
## Lesson 2: Choosing and making friends

Whole Class Activity

Friendship quiz

**Inform** pupils that in this lesson we will be learning about how to **choose** and **make** friends. Learning how to make friends and to be a good friend are extremely important skills. Friends can make us laugh, teach us things and help us develop as individuals.

**Inform** pupils they are going to **complete** a quiz that is going to **ask** them how to make new friends and **discuss** how to be a better friend.

Complete the online friendship quiz as a class by asking pupils to vote for the option they think is correct by raising their hand when it is read out.

**Select** the answer chosen by the majority and **discuss** the feedback given.

Introduce learning objectives and learning outcomes.

Use children friendly alternatives: In this lesson I will:

Qualities of a good friend

Ask pupils what are the qualities they look for in a good friend? It could be the way they behave or the way they make you feel.

**Record** pupil responses on the whiteboard.

Responses could include:

- they are funny
- they are good listeners
- they know how to cheer you up when you are sad
- they know how to play fun games
- they are kind

**Ask** pupils to imagine that they have moved to a new school and are looking for a good friend. The school has asked them to make an advert for a good friend.

Give each pupil a copy of the wanted poster template (**Resource 1**).

**Instruct** pupils to **draw** a picture of an ideal good friend and then **write** a few words to describe what they are looking for using the ideas discussed earlier.

Once the wanted posters are completed, **place** them around the classroom and allow the pupils to **see** each other's work in the form of a gallery viewing.





Elaborate & Reflect

#### Lesson 2: Choosing and making friends

Whole Class & Paired Activities

How to make friends

Explain that we will now be watching a video about a boy called Alvin who was scared he would be rejected at school because of scarring on his body. Let's find out if Alvin manages to make any friends.

Watch the video (2:22).

**Discuss** the following questions as a class:

- Did Alvin manage to make any friends? (Yes)
- Who did he make friends with? (Luke)
- What did Alvin do to help him make friends with Luke? (Letting him have a go first, inviting him to his house so he could spend more time with him)

Ask pupils: What else could we do to help us make friends?

Responses could include:

- find things to share with your friend that you have in common with each other
- start a conversation with them by asking them about their hobbies
- be a good listener
- share your toys with them
- include them in your games

Ask pupils to discuss with their partner how might Alvin have felt if he didn't make any friends.

**Explain** that sometimes it can be difficult to make friends, therefore it is important to try to think about how others may feel and try to include them in our games.



Evaluate & Review

Whole Class & Paired Activities

Good friends

**Read** the following hadith to the class:

The Messenger of Allah said:

You cannot satisfy people with your wealth but satisfy them with your cheerful faces and good morals.'

Bulugh al-Maram

**Explain** to pupils that we **learn** from this hadith that good friends are those that cheer us up and have good manners and behave well.

**Ask** pupils to **reflect** on how they can be better friends.

**Take** feedback on the types of qualities they would like to develop.

Review learning by referring to learning objectives and learning outcomes.

Pose questions to check understanding and clarify misconceptions using think, pair, share:

- What are some of the qualities of a good friend?
- How might it feel not to have any friends?
- What are some of the things we can do to make friends?
- How can you be a better friend?
