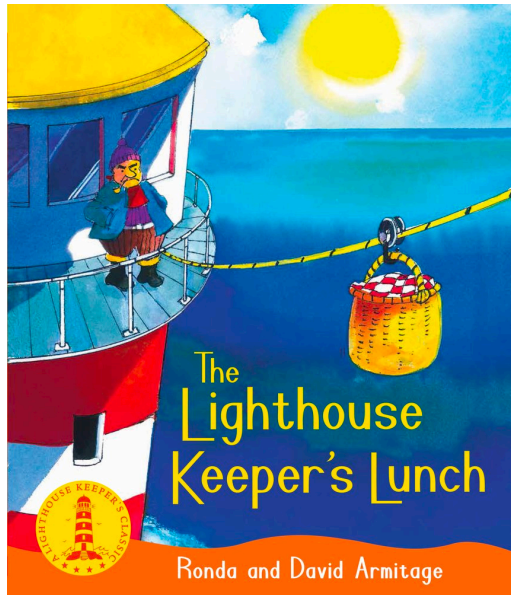

**Themes** - creativity to overcome problems, bravery and emotions

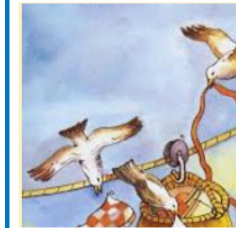

Vocabulary	Definiton
beach	strip of pebble or sand close to the sea
cliff	a steep rock face on the coast
coast	the seashore and the land that is close to it
harbour	where boats can shelter or unload
ocean	salt water covering 3/4 of the Earth
port	a town or city with a harbour
sea	where land meets salt water

**By Robert Louis Stevenson**


When I was down beside the sea

## Explanation texts

Explanation texts usually include these features:

- **Written in the present tense**, in formal language
- Sub-headings to separate sections of text
- **Adverbs of time**, such as: first, then, next, later, finally.
- **Technical vocabulary** (sometimes in bold), for example: if the text is about a beach, it may include words such as 'sand', 'pebbles' and 'coast'.
- Glossary to explain technical vocabulary
- **Diagrams** with labels
- Pictures with **captions**

Vocabulary	Definiton
<b>rhyme</b>	when two words sound the same
<b>simile</b>	when one thing is compared to another using the words 'like' or 'as'
<b>onomatopoeia</b>	when a word imitates its natural sound
<b>couplet</b>	a pair of lines that usually rhyme together
